Once you are on the NAWGJ Education page, to register, click on the title of the clinic(s) you want to attend and complete the registration form. You will receive a confirmation email from Zoom. PLEASE SAVE THE CONFIRMATION EMAIL(s) you receive from ZOOM so you will have the information needed to sign in on the day of the clinic. If you can't find the confirmation email, check your spam and junk mail. Before the clinic, review the ips for Participating in Zoom Clinics on this webpage so you will be prepared to fully participate in the clinics from start to end!

Online clinic hour clarification:

1. At least half (1/2) of your required clinic hours (half of your minimum total requirement) must come from "live" clinic hours.
2. You receive .5 "live" credit for every 1 hour at online clinics (not in-person, like Flipping Education, NAWGJ rapid reviews, etc.). You must be present with your camera on and by answering poll questions.
3. You may not use recorded, archived clinics toward your CPE clinic hours:

VIRTUAL/ONLINE Clinic/Course hours can consist of:

- 1) LIVE (not recorded) CPE-approved VIRTUAL Clinics/Symposiums/Congresses.
 - Clinic organizers MUST receive CPE Clinic approval prior to advertising the event for "Clinic" credits.
 - Communication between the clinician and the registrants is required for these types of education functions to count for Clinic hours.
 - A list of participants must be reported to USA Gymnastics Women's Technical Director at the conclusion of the event.
 - Archived USA Gymnastics webinars are NOT eligible to fulfill any CPE Clinic hours
- 2) USA Gymnastics University Online Judges Courses
 - Only online judges' courses for which you must register with USA Gymnastics will be eligible for Clinic hours/credit.
 - If more than 1/2 of the required clinic hours are earned from online clinics/courses, the extra hours may be applied to the miscellaneous category, if necessary, to meet their total required CPE hours.

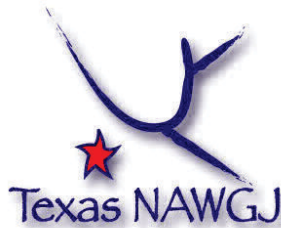


- 1) **Consider social media communications as public at all times** — even if created with private intentions. Consider any communication may be read by anyone at any time.
- 2) **You represent the gymnastics community, NAWGJ, and your fellow judges.** Act accordingly when posting on social media.
- 3) **Promote gymnastics judging in a positive light and with a general feeling of pride and professionalism.** You are an ambassador for gymnastics judging.
- 4) **You have unique access to information. The same ethical restrictions that apply to any form of public speech also apply to social media.** It is inappropriate to communicate specific information about your assignments, other judges, clubs, teams, coaches, gymnasts, or any related personnel.
- 5) **Do not engage in specific judgment, critiques, evaluation and/or commentary, whether it be about a meet you judged, one that you witnessed, or in general about the impact of judging in any event.**
- 6) **Communications among judges for learning purposes should be done privately and not through the use of social media.** Be mindful that posts, email, text messages, and other forms of direct communication can be made public.
- 7) **Be cautious in sharing of your personal information, including photos.** Adjust security settings accordingly. Report fake profiles, inappropriate posts, and unauthorized use of NAWGJ social media accounts or electronic communications to your SJD, RJD, and NAWGJ Secretary.
- 8) **Follow specific NAWGJ social media guidelines to the best of your professional ability.**
